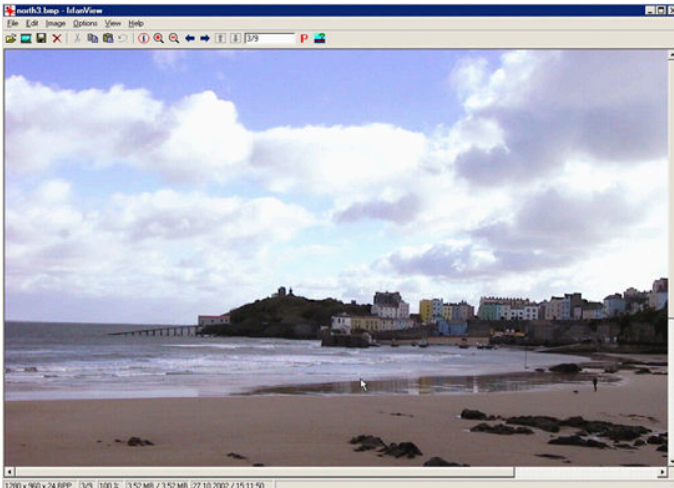
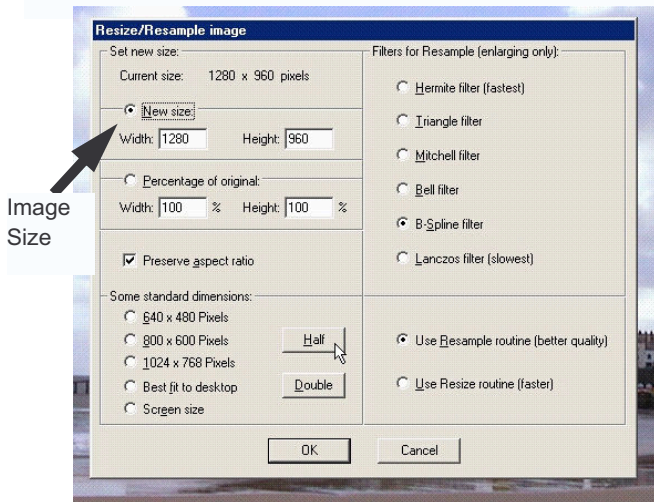


# Useful Things To Do With Irfanview—Resize an Image and Save it For the Web

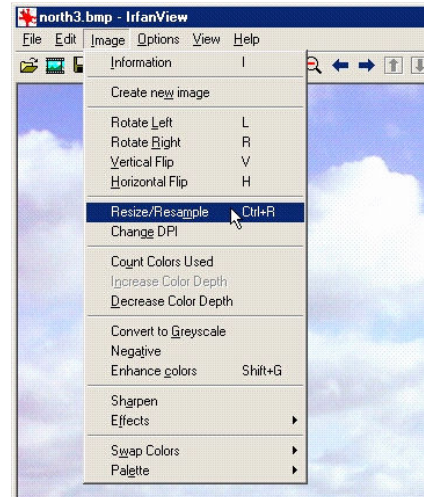
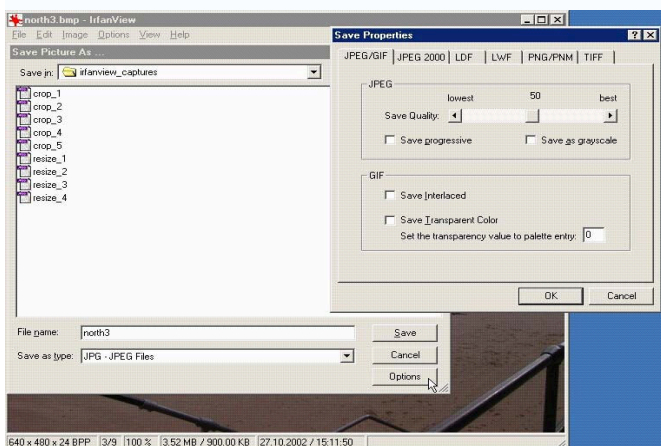

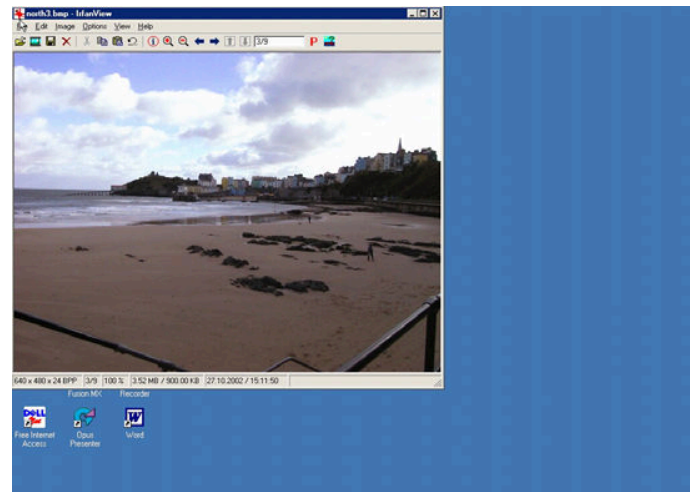
1. Quite often images from digital cameras are very large (high resolution) and more than fill the screen. It is often useful to resize these to fit them on the class whiteboard and it is essential to make them much smaller for a school website.



3. To halve its size click on 'Half', if it is very big you might need to click on 'Half' again. Select 'Best fit to desktop' to fill the screen on an interactive board. A good size for word or publisher is 640 x 480 pixels. For a website halve these dimensions to 320x240 pixels.



2. To reduce the size of our picture here click on 'Image' and 'Resize/Resample'.



4. Click on 'OK' and you'll see your image get smaller. You can make it smaller still by going back to 'Image', 'Resize/Resample'.

5. When you are happy with your image, click on 'File' and 'Save As'. Choose a folder to save your picture in, give your picture a name and save it as a JPEG file. A JPEG works well on the internet, the whiteboard and in presentations.

To save an image as a JPEG look in the 'Save as Type' box (by clicking on the arrow pointing down at the end of the box) and click on JPEG. To alter the picture's quality you can click on 'Options'. A save quality slider appears, choose a setting of around 60-80 for web site pictures (so they download quickly on the internet) and 80-100 for presentations or the whiteboard where quality is more important.
