

## Stori Amser Hamdden – Year 5

### Software - Resources

Story Book Weaver was used for this activity and a printer.

### Context

Through the term the children had learned the language for leisure activities and days of the week. In this final activity, they were asked to include as many different language patterns as they could to show what they had remembered. They also had to speak Welsh.

### Organisation

The children worked in groups of 5/6 in planning the story board on paper and then they worked in the same groups at the computer.

### Activity

In their groups, the children decided on the sports activities they would write about for each day of the week and they made a written note of these. At the computer, they worked on Story Book Weaver and designed their title page. They wrote text onto a further seven pages, one for each day of the week, each time writing about the events of the day and bringing in as many different language patterns that they had learned through the term. They chose appropriate backgrounds, objects and people using rotate and resize if needed. They inserted pre-recorded sounds and then when they were satisfied with their pages, they recorded their own voices speaking the Welsh they had written.

### Conclusion – Extension work

The children could decide how this program could best be used for other subjects—sequencing, ordering.

### Curriculum links

#### *Welsh*

Pupils plan, draft and improve their work on screen and discuss and evaluate their work with others, punctuating appropriately and correctly paying particular attention to spelling.

They have to connect sentences and clauses intelligibly and coherently.

Orally, they take part in a presentation, speak confidently and develop their awareness of pronunciation and intonation.

### ICT curriculum link

Use ICT equipment and software to organise, reorganise and communicating ideas using text, pictures and sound.

### Teacher comments

This task takes quite a time from start to finish so it is an ongoing activity throughout the term but well worth it.
