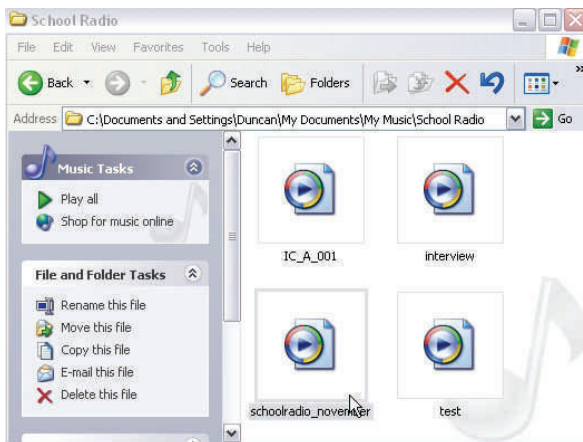


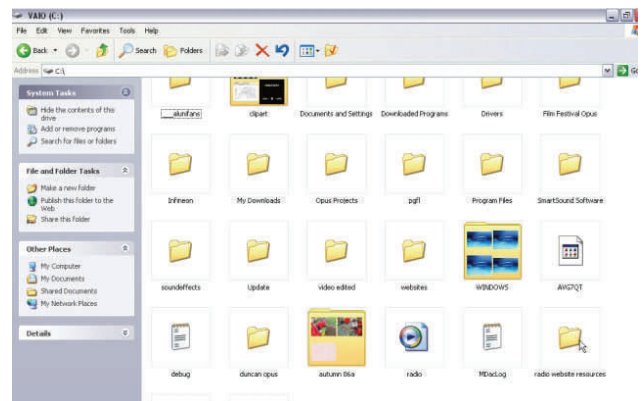
# Add Your Radio Programme to Your School Website Using Net Objects Fusion

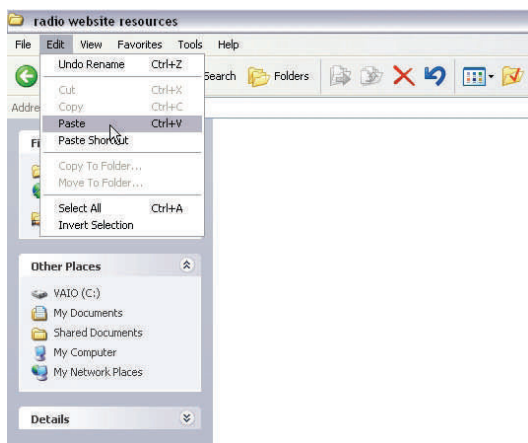

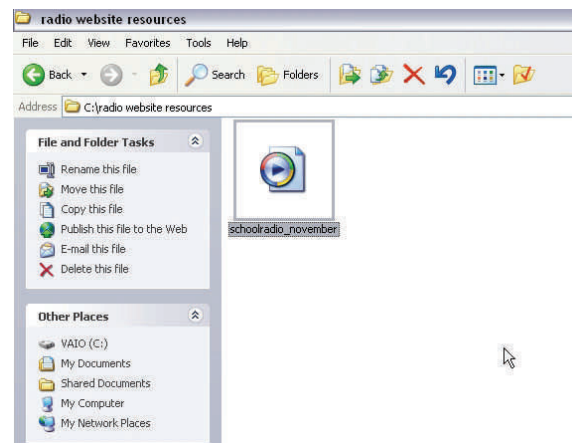
1. Browse to where you have saved your radio programme, click once on it to select it, then click on Edit and Copy.



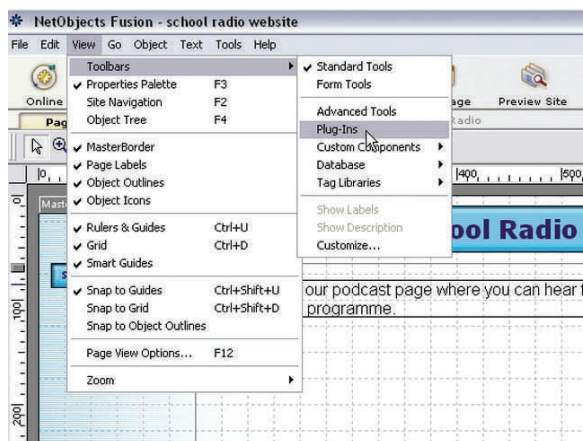
2. Browse to the folder where you keep the images and other resources for your website. Open the folder.



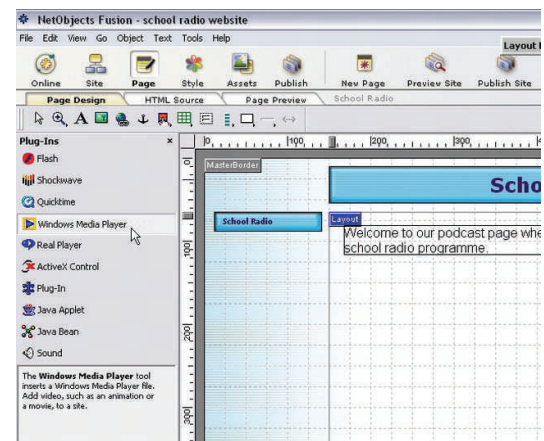
3. Click on Edit and Paste to copy the radio programme to the website resources folder.



4. The next step is to open your website design program. One of the easiest to use is Net Objects Fusion, so we'll use that.



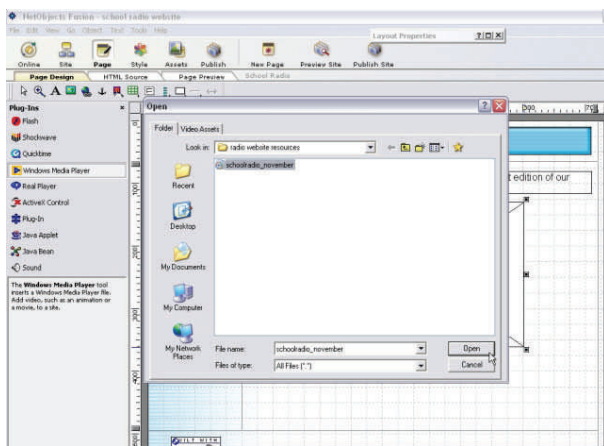
5. I've made a web page in Net Objects Fusion for the radio programme. Click View, Toolbars and Plug Ins.



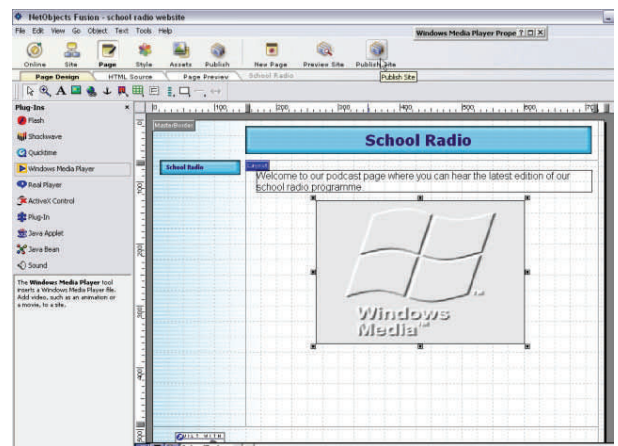
6. From the Plug Ins toolbar select the Windows Media Player or the Quicktime tool.

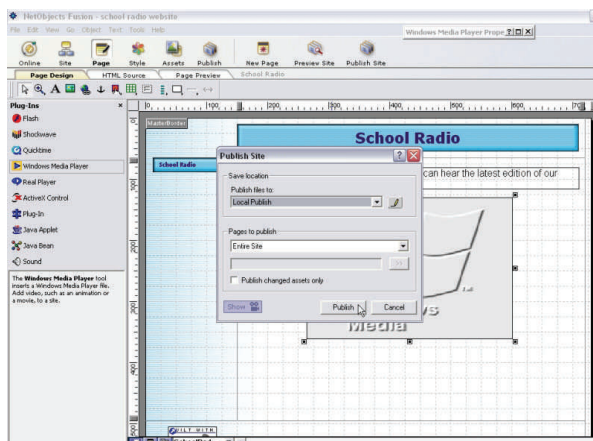

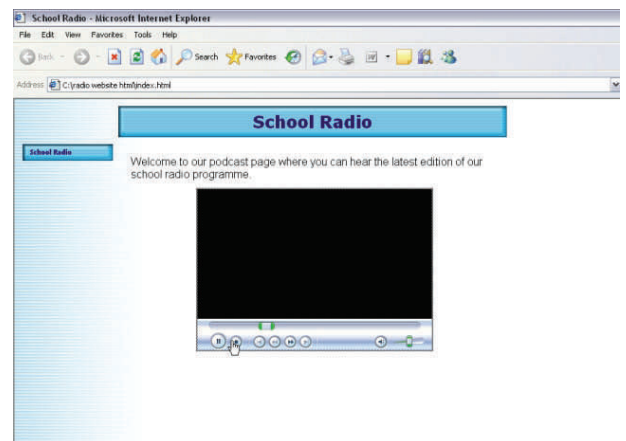
7. Drag out a box for the radio programme then browse for the audio file in the resources folder for your website. Select the radio programme and click on Open.



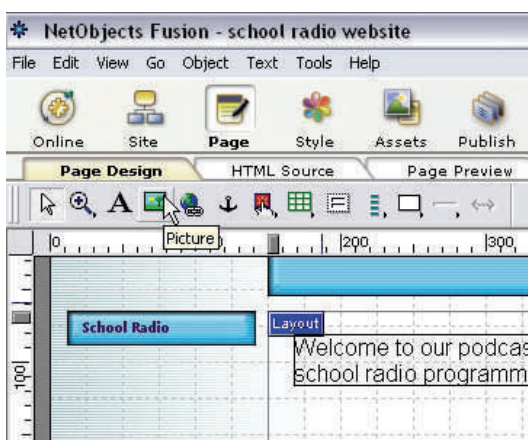
8. The audio file is now linked to the Windows Media Player box I made. To see it working click on Publish Site which turns the page into code ready for the web.



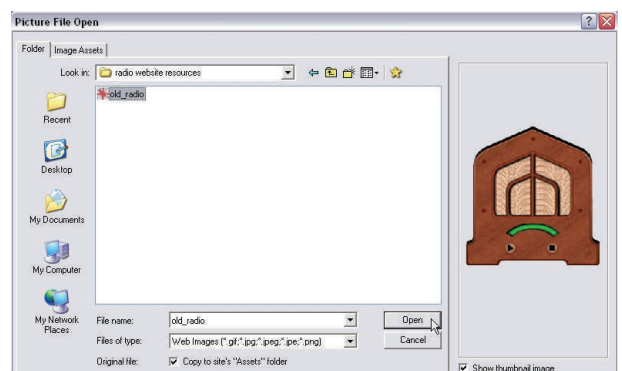
9. Click Publish in the window that opens.



10. Your radio programme plays as a 'Podcast' on your web page. When the website is published to the web your Podcast will be there for the whole world to listen to!



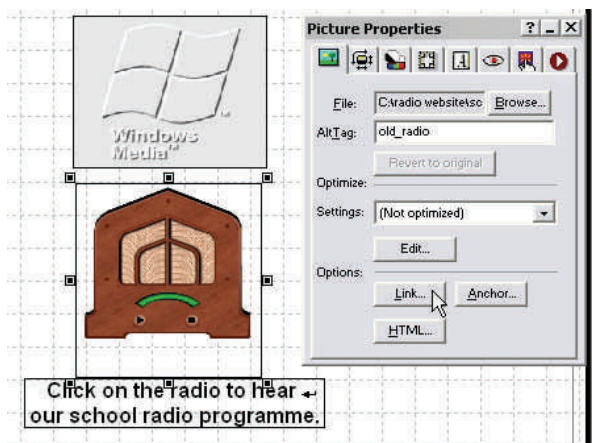
11. Another way to add your radio programme to your website is to link it to a picture on the page so that when you click the picture the programme plays. First, click on the picture tool and drag out a box on the page.



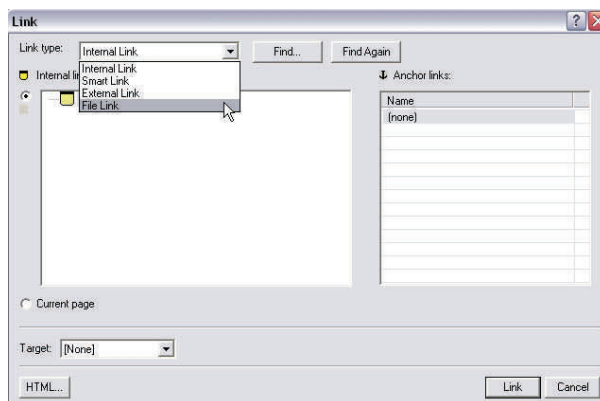
12. The Picture File Open window appears. Click on the drop down arrow to browse for a suitable picture and click on Open.

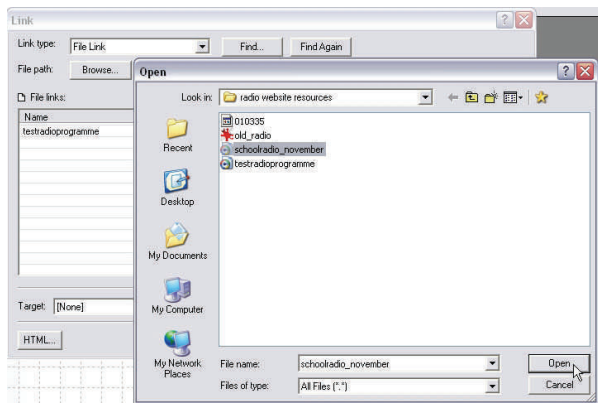

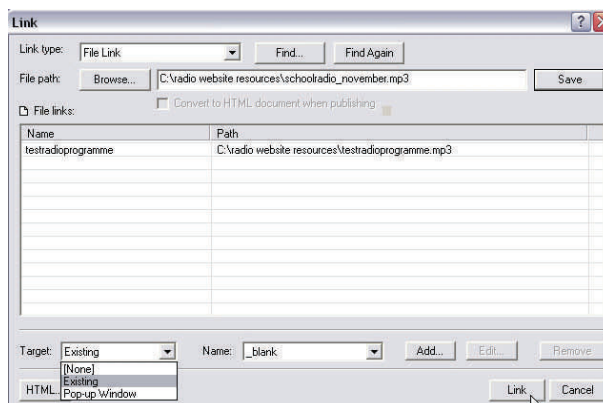
13. Right click on the image to open the Picture Properties box and click on Link.



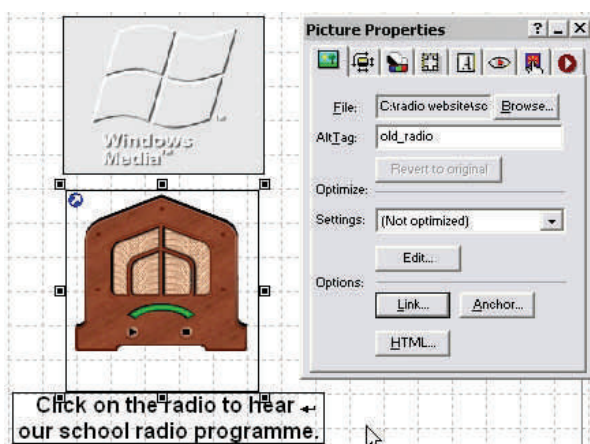
14. Click the drop down arrow in the Link Type box and select File Link.



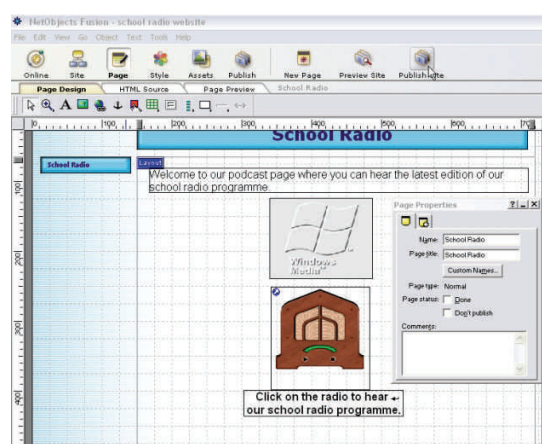
15. Where you see File Path click Browse and look for your radio programme. Click Open



16. Click the drop down arrow next to Target and select Existing and \_blank (this makes the radio programme play in a separate window). Then click on Link.



17. Now the picture has a little blue arrow in the top indicating that it is linked to a file.



18. Click on Publish Site to see the link working. I prefer this method to the previous one because it looks prettier on the page.
